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Good morning, Salvation Army, can I help you?

Det. Hoffman: Yes can I please speak to Mrs. Hall again?

Ahm yes sir, can you hold just a minute?

Det. Hoffman: Sure maam.

Mrs. Hall: Hello may I help you?

Det. Hoffman: Is this Mrs. Hall?

Mrs. Hall: Yes sir.

Det. Hoffman: Det. Hoffman, Hollywood Florida Police Department again.

Mrs. Hall: Yes sir.

Det. Hoffman: I just had to call you back and verify some points okay?

Mrs. Hall: Okay.

Det. Hoffman: On this particular day being July 24th, 1981, you indicated that a ah, OTIS TOOLE came into the Salvation Army and requested that you assist him in getting back to Jacksonville, Florida?

Mrs. Hall: Yes uh huh.

Det. Hoffman: Okay that's what your records indicate is that correct?

Mrs. Hall: Yes uh huh.

Det. Hoffman: Okay and the person that handled this transaction social worker would have been NANCY CHANDLER?

Mrs. Hall: Yes sir.

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Det. Hoffman: Okay. Now does it indicate any time of day this would have been on July 24th of '81.

Mrs. Hall: No we don't keep any timing on it?

Det. Hoffman: Okay do you know what day of the week that was. That would have been on a ah Friday?

Mrs. Hall: (inaudible) and I don't know for sure.

Det. Hoffman: Okay. Now just explain your ah, how you work with the Greyhound Bus people when somebody comes in and requests transportation back to their home town?

Mrs. Hall: Okay well we usually do is of course they have to have I.D. the people do.

Det. Hoffman: The people have to present identification?

Mrs. Hall: Yes uh huh to us. And then we usually call their next of kin and see if their next of kin will take them in, once we get them to where they have to go.

Det. Hoffman: What happens if they have nobody next of kin that are living?

Mrs. Hall: Okay most of the time then if they say they have a job or something we just take their word for it, that they have a job that they have to go to.....

Det. Hoffman: Do you have to verify that job?

Mrs. Hall: No we don't usually go that far of verifying it.

Det. Hoffman: Okay.

Mrs. Hall: And ah then what we usually do is we go to the the, we call the Greyhound Bus Station and we tell them that we are

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sending like OTIS TOOLE and that he would need a one-way ticket to Jacksonville.

Det. Hoffman: Right.

Mrs. Hall: And according to our records this one person was interviewed and assisted.

Det. Hoffman: Right.

Mrs. Hall: And then what we do is we tell the people that ah, what time that they have to be at the Greyhound Bus Station and ahm where they go to pick up the ticket and then the Greyhound Bus Station in turn they take and bill the Salvation Army and we pay one big lump.

Det. Hoffman: How far is the Greyhound Bus Station from your ah...

Mrs. Hall: It didn't used to be too far ahm, now it's a little further away from where it was.

Det. Hoffman: Would Mr. Toole have to walk there or do you people drive him to the Greyhound Bus?

Mrs. Hall: No he would have to find his own transportation to that point.

Det. Hoffman: Okay.

Mrs. Hall: It used to be on the other end of town on West Avenue in Newport News but right now they tore that down and it's on the other end of Jefferson.

Det. Hoffman: What does he present to the Greyhound Bus people when he arrives?

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Mrs. Hall: Okay more than likely he would have presented to them either a paper from us or a drivers license proving that he is who he is.

Det. Hoffman: Right.

Mrs. Hall: Usually we don't usually send a referral slip with them, we just tell them that we are sending whoever we're sending.

Det. Hoffman: So he doesn't handle any money or anything like that?

Mrs. Hall: No uh uh.

Det. Hoffman: Now what happens if this individual that you referred to the Greyhound Bus terminal fails to show up? What happens if he changes his mind? Do these Greyhound people notify you that he didn't?

Mrs. Hall: They're supposed to.

Det. Hoffman: Right.

Mrs. Hall: And whether they did or not I don't know because I was not in this office, you know when this was (inaudible)

Det. Hoffman: Well would you have any records to show that the Greyhound Bus people billed you for one fare to Jacksonville?

Mrs. Hall: As far as I can check there is no record you know that we had even purchased a ticket but, except for the statistics that we do, we have to do paperwork of who we help, and how much we help and what we help them with, okay? And the only thing that I have is on the end of the month of July in '81 there was a OTIS TOOLE who we helped with one bus

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fare to get to Jacksonville, Florida, it was one person, one interview and ah...

Det. Hoffman: What form of documentation do you have on that showing the July 24th date.

Mrs. Hall: Okay it's just a, we keep a paper that has everybody that we would help during the day...

Det. Hoffman: A log like?

Mrs. Hall: Yes uh hmm. And we have to keep a record of that and we keep them for seven years...

Det. Hoffman: Seven years.

Mrs. Hall: And on those, on those, and on that particular piece of paper ahm we take and we put how many cases we've handled for the day. We put the date, we put the name of the person and then we put how many you know are involved in the case and then we put who we helped, what type of help we give them. In other words if it's a (inaudible) rent or a bus ticket and if it's a bus ticket we check where it's to.

Det. Hoffman: I see.

Mrs. Hall: Okay, and then we put how many people we've interviewed and if we've called anyone to contact to see if someone is there and will accept you know like accept him to come into their home once he gets there.

Det. Hoffman: I see.

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Mrs. Hall: And there is no record that anyone was called on that particular case.

Det. Hoffman: Okay what is your ah address for the Salvation Army in Newport News?

Mrs. Hall: Okay it's Salvation Army, 5872 Jefferson Avenue, Newport News.

Det. Hoffman: Okay and your phone number?

Mrs. Hall: Okay the phone number is 247-5781.

Det. Hoffman: 804 area code correct?

Mrs. Hall: Yes sir.

Det. Hoffman: The documentation that you have on this log ah is it possible that I could get a copy of that mailed to my department here?

Mrs. Hall: I don't see why not.

Det. Hoffman: Okay. Like I said this is involving a homicide investigation and it's very critical that we have this documentation.

Mrs. Hall: I don't see why not.

Det. Hoffman: Okay if you would if you can make me this copy and send it certified mail this way I know I'll receive it, ah we'd appreciate that.

Mrs. Hall: Okay let me take the address. Alright...

Det. Hoffman: It's Det. Hoffman, H-o-f-f-m-a-n..Hollywood Police Department 3250 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, Florida 33021, Attn: Homicide Division.

Mrs. Hall: Okay.

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Det. Hoffman: Now I was wondering, do you have the phone number for the Greyhound Bus people that I could contact?

Mrs. Hall: Okay, let me get that for you. Okay you would need to call ahm, 599-3900.

Det. Hoffman: Any specific individual that deals with you?

Mrs. Hall: Okay that is the fare and information or any kind of information number.

Det. Hoffman: Right.

Mrs. Hall: They have another number that might even be a little bit better. They have a district manager number.

Det. Hoffman: What's the number for that?

Mrs. Hall: Okay that number is 244...

Det. Hoffman: Right.

Mrs. Hall: 8585.

Det. Hoffman: And that's the district manager?

Mrs. Hall: Yes sir. And his ah, the address for that is 9702 Jefferson Avenue, Newport News.

Det. Hoffman: Okay so I appreciate that Mrs. Hall and if you get that out to us as soon as possible we'd appreciate it.

Mrs. Hall: Okay.

Det. Hoffman: Thank you again for your assistance.

Mrs. Hall: You're welcome.

Det. Hoffman: Okay bye now.
