In October of 1983, two Hollywood Police Department detectives investigating the Adam Walsh homicide arrived in Jacksonville. They requested FDLE assistance in processing a 1971 Cadillac, as mentioned in the attached FDLE memos.

This processing was completed on November 2nd, again noted on FDLE reports. This FDLE memo further states the vehicle and carpets were sealed for delivery to the Hollywood Police Department.

The FDLE memo dated November 9, 1983, states items 7 through 14 were insufficient for further tests. These items were found to be of no evidentiary value. The sample was insufficient to determine if it was animal or human bloodstains. Again, these items were gathered, processed, and held for the Hollywood Police Department.

On November 18, 1983, the investigator from Hollywood responsible for the evidence elected to retrieve item #15 from the Crime Lab in Jacksonville. He chose to leave items 7 through 14, the 1971 Cadillac, and the three boxes of carpet.

On May 24, 1984, after the vehicle, its contents and other items were found to be at FDLE, JSO Detective Geisenburg went to FDLE and signed for the property. This was done as a courtesy for the Hollywood Police Department, giving consideration that their agency had not picked up this evidence for over six months.

REFERENCE:

This report is in reference to a vehicle processing done by the Jacksonville Crime Scene Unit as requested by Detective Jack Hoffman of the Hollywood Police Department.

SCENE:

On October 20, 1983, the Crime Scene Unit went to the Wells Brothers Used Car Lot located at 4334 Brentwood Avenue, Jacksonville, Florida. Parked on the lot was a white 1971 Cadillac Sedan de Ville, VIN 683491Q134601 and bearing no license tag.

On October 31, 1983, the vehicle was delivered to the Jacksonville Regional Crime Laboratory at 120 Platen Road, Jacksonville, Florida for further processing.

ASSISTANCE RENDERED:

On October 20, 1983 the interior of the vehicle was processed for serological and microanalytical evidence. The seats, carpets, and trunk were sprayed with luminol, a chemical presumptive test for trace amounts of blood.

ASSISTANCE RENDERED (cont.):

On November 2, 1983, the interior and exterior of the vehicle was photographed. The interior carpets were removed for further luminol spraying and collection of serological and microanalytical evidence. The vehicle was then given to the Latent Print Section for processing.

REMARKS:

On October 20, 1983 the spraying of luminol gave positive indications on the left front and left rear interior floorboard carpets. These non-descript areas were photographed and sketched.

On November 2, 1983 the carpets were re-examined with the application of luminol. The areas of luminescence were photographed and samples were taken. A report on the results of the luminol sprayings will be issued from the Serology Section of this laboratory.

Four (4) rolls of 120mm and one (1) roll of 35mm color negative film were used to photograph the scene.

The film will be developed by laboratory personnel and the negatives retained in the files of this department.

RESULTS:

Exhibits #7 thru #14

The "carpets and padding from the front and rear floorboards of the 1971 White Cadillac Sedan de Ville" were treated with luminol, a presumptive chemical test for bloodstaining. Areas of strongly persistent luminescence were noted on the portion of "carpet from driver's side", on the portion of "carpet from left rear floorboard", and on the "padding underneath the carpet from left rear floorboard". These results as well as separate chemical tests demonstrated the presence of a trace of bloodstaining on these carpets and padding. There was an insufficient amount of blood for further tests.

Exhibit #15

Chemical tests on the blade edge of the "machette" demonstrated the presence of a trace of bloodstaining in a quantity that was insufficient for further testing.

Chemical tests for bloodstaining on the "canvas sheath" were inconclusive.

REMARKS:

Debris from the "machette blade" and from the "canvas sheath" will be forwarded to the Microanalysis section of the Tallahassee Regional Crime Laboratory. Results of their analysis and the disposition of the evidence will be the subject of a separate report.
