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Ah he was a laborer, ah he did what he was told, and he worked hard, ah he was under different foreman's direction.

- Q. Did there come a time that he couldn't make any more payments on your aunt's vehicle that he returned it to her?
- A. I really don't know the circumstances about that Cadillac ah, you know I know that he had it at one time and then he give it back and I don't know the circumstances why.
- Q. As an employee for ah your company would he have keys to the compound where the vehicles are stored?
- A. Not in my yard, I don't recall if he ever did my yard.
- Q. No, I'm referring to....
- A. REAVES ROOFING?
- Q. R.B. GATE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, where Mrs. McNETT kept her vehicle in that compound.
- A. Alright, even though that's my father's business we are totally separate and independent as you have heard the problem we've had today.
- Q. Right.
- A. I don't know that OTTIS was given keys however I think at one time OTTIS was maintaining the office of something I believe he was doing janitorial

I understand it's two years later a little more than two years later, do you have any recollection if ah you have ever seen OTTIS on or about that time, July of '81 in Jacksonville?
- A. I, I can honestly answer, I can't say.
- Q. Do you have any knowledge if a social service worker from the Salvation Army in Newport News contacted your company to verify OTTIS' employment there at one time so that they could give him bus money to get back to Jacksonville from Newport News.
- A. I recall someone talking to me and ah I think they asked me if they got him back could he have a job and I told them he could.
- Q. You recall a conversation with someone to that effect?
- A. Ah vaguely but I think I recall it yes.
- Q. Okay well that telephone call would have been made to your company on July 24, 1981, okay now if you could just recall for a minute, after they said they were going to send him back to Jacksonville do you remember ever seeing him a short time thereafter, after you received that phone call? Maybe to come over and borrow money or something?

A. I'm not sure, I know he came back in December and worked one day I think,

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I'm not sure if he did come back and say he was gonna come back to work or not, ah, I know that I stopped on the side of the road on Market Street, somewhere about First and Market or somewhere in that area and I saw him and asked him was he ever gonna come back to work and pay off the debt that he owed me?

- Q. I see, do you know what time of the year that was?
- A. It was during the summer.
- Q. Of what year.
- A. I'm not sure, I think it was '82 or '81, I don't recall.
- Q. Okay.
- A. I don't recall what year, what date it was but I know it was ah, it was in the summer and I'm not sure if it was '81 or '82.
- Q. Alright ah.
- A. I don't know when the last date was he worked with me, the records would show and it was just before that.
- Q. The records I viewed this morning indicated June 4, 1981, would have been the last date.
- A. That he worked for me?
- Q. Right.
- A. Yeah but was the full time or, or when did he mother die?
- Q. His mother died on May 16th and was buried on May 19th of 1981.
- A. Alright well, yeah it had to be a year later.
- Q. Okay so that would have been '82?
- A. Yeah he was working in '82 I think he was working for ahm, ah a housing

- A. Yeah and I don't know if, with all the trucks in there I don't know, I forgot where it was parked. I don't know I believe it would have been seen if it was gone.
- Q. Alright. Do you know any of his co-employees that were close to OTTIS that I might be able to speak to that maybe would be able to give me additional information about him or his whereabouts on a particular date?

 A. OTTIS didn't, ah he argued about the men all the time not working like, alot of times he went out to my house, him and LUCAS went to my house and ah matter of fact he came into my house and called me from the house and ah told me the men wasn't working and he was just mad about the whole situation and I said OTTIS is tellin them he's gonna lose his job if they don't go to work which he went back out and got 'em to work and he never was close to any of the workers.
